

Tidal treasures The narrow medieval streets that lead up to the abbey on Mont Saint-Michel are delightfully deserted during February and March, making it the ideal time to visit. Other reasons to head to Normandy this season are the fresh scallops and Chausey lobster served by chef Guillaume Lerous at L'Ermitage, a new boutique hotel with seven luxury suites, 4km from the landmark. COUNTRY KITCHEN

Relax in the Umbrian countryside and discover the region's gourmet secrets on a new cooking escape in Perugia. The five-night, small-group trip from Expressions Holidays includes cooking classes exploring all aspects of Umbrian cuisine and Italian cooking methods, held on three consecutive days at the Villa di Monte Solare, a member of Small Luxury Hotels, located a few miles south of Lake Trasimeno. Casa Angelina is a little piece of heaven in the heart of the Amalfi Coast. Perched on the cliffs in the sleepy village of Praiano, the hotel looks out onto breathtaking view of sea and sky, with picturesque Positano across the bay. The hotel has 39 spacious.

The hotel has 39 spacious, light-filled rooms and suites, each with its own private sea-view balcony or terrace; contemporary clean lines and simple finishes accentuate the wonderful light and beauty of the location. As well as both indoor and



outdoor pools, there is access to a private beach on the shore below the hotel, and an extensive spa and wellness centre that offers daily private yoga and Pilates classes for virtuous guests. The hotel's rooftop restaurant affords both fabulous views and great cuisine, centered around

GOURMET GEM

Hugging the coastline in the Irish village of Ardmore, Cour Waterford, The Cliff House is beautiful property both inside and out. The hotel, which oper in 2009 on the site of a forme inn dating from 1900, overloc Ardmore Bay and blends into the landscape remarkably we for a contemporary stone-and glass building. A modest footprint at ground level belie its sizeable interior: the lobby (on level five) unfurls to revea 39 spacious rooms over six floors. On level three, a 15-me infinity pool boasts views of the Irish Sea, plus a sauna, outdo hot tub and The Well spa, offering Voya treatments. A natural seawater pool provide



swimming options for the brav in summer, while, year-round one can stroll around blustery Ardmore Head and Ram's He or towards the twelfth-centur Round Tower. The dramatic location isn't the only attractic of this Relais & Châteaux property. The Cliff House als boasts Ireland's only Michelin starred hotel restaurant - The House, run by Dutch chef Mar Kajuiter. Kajuiter embraces the native produce (West Cork scallops, Clare Island organic salmon, Ballynatray pigeon) while adding plenty of surprise to traditional Irish dishes.
